Alternative Lunch Menu Conversation (AM Meeting Pressentation, Reviewed at PM Meeting)

Anna shared examples of the current lunch menu as well as the alternative lunch menu.

- Both menus offer entree alternatives (cold lunch)
- The alternative lunch menu includes:
 - less processed food
 - Entrees made from scratch with fresh vegetables
 - Fewer meat entrees
 - More plant and bean-based entrees

The alternative lunch menu doesn't include the fried finger foods on the regular menu (mozzarella sticks, Jamaican patties, chicken bites, fish patties, & chicken patties)

Parent Comment: Kids like mozzarella sticks

Parents get to make a recommendation to the school if they want to adopt the alternative menu

Anna from School Food: "Less kids are lining up for lunch at schools where menus were changed." This is based on observations at two middle schools and one elementary school.

Parent question: Are these the only two options?

Vegetarian menu is also available

Parent question: Is chocolate milk always offered?

- Currently there are 3 options: fat-free chocolate milk, 1% milk, fat-free milk
- Water is also available

Parent question: Is it possible to take away the chocolate milk option?

Principal has to request it (Parents express interest in this option.)

Parent question: Can we only have it on certain days?

Yes

Parent question: How long would it take to transfer over?

- One month later--2 months depending on when orders go in
- We have the option to switch back

Next Steps:

- 1) Family survey will go out about alternative lunch menu and chocolate milk. Naomi Touger from the evening meeting offered to draft survey.
- 2) Survey results will be reviewed by SLT at February meeting.

3) Decision will be shared at February PTA meeting.

President's Report

- PTA By-Laws Update
 - By-laws are currently being revised by executive board. They will be presented at a future PTA meeting
- SLT Updates
 - Steam Lab Upgrade Grant from Brooklyn Borough President's Office--\$125,000
 - Integrated Units--What is parent feedback on integrated units?
 - Parent Comments:
 - My child came home talking a lot about what they learned
 - It was interesting and exciting for a lot of children
 - It would have been good to know about the unit in advance so that parents can reinforce concepts at home
 - School is working on improving school-home communication. What are your thoughts regarding school-home communication?
 - Family Comments:
 - Don't know what child is learning during the school day
 - Verbal teacher report is different than the report card
 - Homework is not what child learned in the class. Homework seems to be mostly skills practice and not a representation of what's going on that day in class
 - Families want to know what to do to help kids at home
 - Families want to know what kids are learning
 - There is confusion around the report card
 - It was difficult to know what questions to ask at Back to School Night. Seems like only chance to have grade level meeting with teachers
 - Family Suggestions:
 - Kids should be encouraged to share more about what they learn
 - Units need to be sent home
 - A blurb about what the class is learning each week could be handwritten on homework packets
 - Use Remind and Class Dojo to share what goes on in the class
 - Improve homework checks--currently it's confusing and not consistent
 - Conduct a monthly meeting with grade team and families (similar to curriculum night)
 - Use Tuesdays after school for curriculum meetings with families
 - Use Family Fridays to inform parents about current units of study
 - Offer afterschool homework tutoring
 - Ms. Smith--We have reached out to CBOs (Community Based Organizations) who could offer those kinds of programs
